Panel & Conference Chairperson


Dr. Sorrell is the Robert L. Grissom Professor of Medicine in the Section of Gastroenterology and Hepatology at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

After completing his bachelor's and medical degrees at the University of Nebraska, he continued his training there with a residency in both internal medicine and gastroenterology. He subsequently completed a traineeship in hepatic disease and nutrition at the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry.



Dr. Sorrell is a past President of the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases and the International Liver Transplant Society, which he also helped found. Additionally, the Michael F. Sorrell Center for Health Science Education, funded entirely through public donations, was opened this past June to help recognize his 37 years of service to the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

Dr. Sorrell is widely published in both basic and clinical hepatology research. His areas of expertise include ethanol metabolism, alcohol-induced liver disease, and liver transplantation. He has also published several book chapters, as well as two books, *Transplantation of the Liver, 3rd Edition* and *Diseases of the Liver, 10th edition*.
